If you would take such things as you want to send to me by mail to Tera Haute, where they know what the law is on Postage, you would have no trouble in sending anything that does not weigh more than four pounds and the price is sixteen cents per pound. The law passed last winter, and the Soldiers are getting packages every day, but the post master in Paricton does not know what is right, you have paid 24 cents for two plugs of tobacco, that was enough to pay the postage on one pound and a half by the office at Tera Haute.
