ELIGIBILITY CLAUSE

"Any woman is eligible for membership in the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution who is not less than eighteen years of age, and who is descended from a man or woman who, with unflinching loyalty to the cause of American Independence, served as a sailor, or as a soldier or civil officer in one of the several Colonies or States, or in the United Colonies or States, or as a recognized patriot, or rendered material aid thereto; provided the applicant is personally acceptable to the Society." (Constitution, Article III, Section 1.)

*Marriage in every instance in this paper means legal and lawful marriage.
Date of marriage may be substituted for date of birth and death where such date proves the soldier to have been living during the Revolution and of a suitable age for service.
(Note: Enactment adopted by the twenty-fourth Congressional Congress:
Descendants of polygamous marriage are not acceptable as members of this Society.)

ANCESTOR'S SERVICES

My ancestor's services in assisting in the establishment of American Independence during the War of the Revolution were as follows:

Served in Captain Thomas Berry's Co. of the 8th Virginia force. Commenced by Col. Abram Bowman first as Purser and later as Sergeant.

See National 78794 Sons of American Revolution. Photostatic copy in Virginia State Library, of an original pay roll in the War Department, for 4th and June 1777. He received pay for two months at the rate of 6 2/3 dollars a month. "Auditor's Account" Volume in Virginia State Library 710. 3 for 1783 page 258, 259 Feb. 1783. Brig. Kerschel, Sergeant, received interest due him on pay due Aug. 2nd 1783.

The said Benjamin

is the ancestor who assisted in establishing American Independence, while acting in the capacity of sergeant in Captain Thomas Berry's Co. 8th Va. Regiment under Col. Abraham Bowman. Also in Capt. James Berry's Co. 7th Virginia Regt.
