Personally appeared before me the undersigned a Justice of the Peace within and for the County of Greene and State aforesaid, Polley M^c Bride, a resident of Cap Township in Sullivan County and State of Indiana, aged 56 years, the 1st day of January 1853, who being duly sworn according to law, doth on her oath make the following declaration in order to obtain the benefit of the provisions made by the law of the United States, passed the 3rd day of February 1853. That she is the widow of Allen M^c Bride late of said County of Sullivan deceased who was a private in the Company commanded by Capt. -ain John English in the Regiment commanded by Col Branch, (of the Tennessee Volunteers) in the war of 1812. declared by the United States against Great Britain the 18th day of June 1812. that her said husband volunteered at Parkerborough, Tennessee on or about the 28th day of April 1814 in 5th Company for the term of 6 months & that he actually served in said war for the term of 6 months & 4 days, and was honorably discharged at Ray County Tennessee on the 14th day of June 1814. That she was married to the said Allen M^c Bride on the 3rd ^{day of} March 1811. at the County of Anderson in Tennessee, by Samuel M^c Coy a Justice of the Peace, that her husband the aforesaid Allen M^c Bride ^{decd} on the 7th day of October 1853. and that she was a widow at the time of the passage of said act of Congress of the 3rd of February 1853. And is still a widow. and that she has never made application for a pension. And that the following are her children names & ages, William M^c Bride now 40 years, John M^c Bride now 35 years, Louisa M^c Intosh, now 32 years, ^{now 30^{1/2} years} Lucretia ^{now 30^{1/2} years} Joe, Silas M^c Bride now 28 years, James M^c Bride now 26 years, Luinda Duncan now 24 years, Lavinia
