Sullivan County, p. 3 On this 30th day of August A.D. one thousand eight hundred and fifty two, personally appeared before me, a justice of the peace within and for said county and state, Aldert Plough, aged ninety years, a resident of said county of Sullivan in the State of Indiana, who being duly sworn according to law, declares that he is the identical Aldert Plough who was a private in the company commanded by Captain, P. Westbrook, in the Regiment commanded by Colonel Rosecrance in the war of the Revolution: that he enlisted at Westbrook's fort on the Delaware River, on or about the 1st day of May in the year A.D. 1781, for the term of six months and continued in actual service in said war for the term of six months, and was honorably discharged at Winchester on the 1st day of October A.D. 1781, by reason of the termination of said war, as will appear by the muster rolls of said company.

He makes this declaration for the purpose of obtaining the pension to which he may be entitled under the acts of Congress of 1832, and he further declares that he has never
